Report on Kotahitanga Pou Tikanga has done for the NICF hui – submitted by Bill Hamilton 24 April 2024

There has been increasing korero about what a Rangatiratanga Sphere might look like at the national level. Here is a summary of what has been said to date.

Vision: All whānau will achieve their potential

WHY have a Rangatiratanga Sphere?

- Our whānau are under attack, and we need a strong political presence to protect them
- It will give us more power
- It will protect and revitalise our taonga
- It is what we had pre-colonisation
- Our power is within our whānau, hapū, iwi and Māori organisations. This will harness that power

WHAT will a Rangatiratanga Sphere do?

- Support and protect the rangatiratanga of whānau, hapū, iwi and rōpū Māori
- Provide leadership for national and international issues
- Collaborate with whānau, hapū, iwi and Māori organisations taking action against the Crown
- Build relationships with Tauiwi organisations
- Engage internationally.
- Provide a constitutional presence for our whānau
- Engage with the Crown in the relational sphere

HOW will it work?

- Follow the format of the recent Hui Taumata
- Include all whānau. Leave no one behind. Be accessible
- Establish a leadership team that includes rangatahi
- Provide accountability
- Be values based. Mana Atua, Mana Whenua, Mana Tangata
- Built around Tikanga, He Whakaputanga, Te Tiriti and international human rights standards

Next steps

- Keep developing our thinking at future hui Taumata
- Build relationships with supportive organisations
- Discuss with your whanau
- Engage with the United Nations
- Unite around national projects e.g. election 2026
- Have Iwi-led Tiriti conversations locally
- Public education about He Whakaputanga, Te Tiriti and Rangatiratanga

Emerging Priorities The following are the issues emerging as priorities for acting collectively:

- The well-being of our Tamariki
- Taiao issues including land, water and climate change
- Te Reo
- Protecting Te Tiriti and whānau rights
